Just as every college is different, so too are the criteria and priorities in each college's admision process.

Academic Rigor: Evidence of success with challenging curriculum, such as AP or Dual Enrollment courses.

Involvement in a few meaningful extracurricular activites either in school or outside of school.

High GPA in major subjects. However, slightly lower grades in AP courses are preferred to all A's I n less challenging courses.

Depth of study in areas such as foreign language or mathematics.

- High scores on standardized tests (ACT). These should be consistent with high school performance.
- Leadership inside or outside of school. Depth, rather than breadth, of leadership is valued.

A well written essay that emphasizes insight into the student's unique personality.

- Strong counselor / teacher recommendations that provide personalized references.
- Student's character and values are seen as conducive to being a good community member.
- Special talents that could contribute to campus life.
